WEATHER OUTLOOK ISSUED ON 13.04.2025 AND

VALID 00:00 14.04.2025 TO 23:59 16.04.2025

FORECAST OUTLOOK:

Monday 14th: Slight Dust Haze is anticipated over the Northern region with prospect of afternoon/evening thunderstorms over parts of Adamawa, Taraba and Kaduna states. In the North central region, sunny skies with patches of clouds are expected with prospects of isolated thunderstorms over parts of Plateau, the Federal Capital Territory, Niger, Nasarawa, Kwara, Kogi and Benue states during the afternoon/evening hours. In the Southern region, cloudy skies are expected with chances of isolated morning thunderstorms over parts of Cross River and Akwa Ibom states. Later in the day, isolated thunderstorms are anticipated over most parts of the southern regions.

Tuesday 15th: Sunny and hazy skies are expected across the Northern region with prospects of afternoon/evening thunderstorms over parts of Kaduna, Taraba and Adamawa states. Sunny skies with patches of clouds are expected across the North Central region with prospects of thunderstorms over parts of Kogi, the Federal Capital Territory, Nasarawa, Kwara, Plateau and Benue states during the afternoon/evening hours. In the Southern region, cloudy skies with intervals of sunshine are anticipated with prospects of morning thunderstorms over parts of Akwa Ibom, Bayelsa, Rivers and Cross River states. In the afternoon/evening hours, thunderstorms are expected over most parts of the southern regions.

Wednesday 16th: Sunny skies are expected across the Northern region with prospects of isolated thunderstorms over parts of Sokoto, Kebbi, Kaduna, Taraba Adamawa and Kebbi states during the afternoon/evening hours. Sunny skies with patches of clouds are expected across the North Central region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms over most parts of the region during the afternoon/evening hours. In the South, morning thunderstorms are expected over parts of Delta, Rivers,

Cross River and Akwa Ibom states. Later in the day, isolated thunderstorms are expected over most parts of the southern regions.

Advisory:

- i. Temperatures are high over most parts of the country, putting people at risk of heat stress; people should stay in well-ventilated and cool spaces.
- ii. Drink plenty water to stay hydrated.
- iii. Get vaccinated against meningitis, practice good hygiene by washing hands regularly, avoid overcrowding in small spaces, use a nose mask to reduce chances of infection and avoid close contact with those affected.
- iv. Avoid peak sun hours (12pm – 3pm) and protect yourselves from undue exposure to direct sunlight.
- v. Strong winds may precede the rains in areas where thunderstorms are likely to occur, public should take adequate precaution.
- vi. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
