



Weather Outlook

Day 1: Monday 28th July, 2025

Northern Region:

Thunderstorms with moderate rains are anticipated during the morning hours over parts of Jigawa, Zamfara, Kano, Kaduna, Bauchi, Yobe and Katsina states, while the remaining parts of the region is expected to be sunny with patches of cloud. Thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected during the afternoon/evening hours over parts of Jigawa, Zamfara, Kano, Kaduna, Bauchi, Yobe, Katsina, Kebbi, Adamawa and Taraba states. However, there are chances of flash flood occurring over parts of Bauchi, Jigawa, Katsina, Kaduna and Kano states during the forecast period.

Central Region:

Cloudy skies are anticipated over the region during the morning hours with prospects of light to moderate rains over parts of Niger, Benue, the Federal Capital Territory, Plateau and Nasarawa states. In the afternoon/evening hours, rains are anticipated over parts of Plateau, Nasarawa, the Federal Capital Territory, Kogi, Benue and Niger states. There is high possibility of flash flood occurring over parts of Plateau state during the forecast period.

Southern Region:

Cloudy skies are expected over this region during the morning period. Light to moderate rain is expected over parts of Ondo, Imo, Abia, Enugu, Ebonyi, Anambra, Edo, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 2: Tuesday 29th July, 2025

Northern Region:

Sunny skies with patches of clouds are expected over the region during the morning hours with prospects of thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of Adamawa, Taraba, Yobe, Kaduna, Bauchi, Gombe, Jigawa, Katsina and Kano states. Thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected during the afternoon/evening hours over parts of Adamawa, Taraba, Jigawa, Kano, Kaduna, Katsina, Sokoto and Kebbi states.

Central Region:

Morning light to moderate rains are anticipated over parts of Niger, Benue, the Federal Capital Territory, Kogi, Plateau and Nasarawa states. Afternoon/evening moderate rains are anticipated over parts of Plateau, Niger, the Federal Capital Territory, Kwara, Kogi and Nasarawa states.

Southern Region:

Cloudy skies are expected over the region during the morning hours with chances of rains over parts of Akwa Ibom and Cross River states. Moderate rains are expected over parts of Abia, Delta, Rivers, Cross River, Akwa Ibom and Bayelsa states during the afternoon/evening periods.

Day 3: Wednesday 30th July, 2025

Northern Region:

Sunny skies with patches of cloud are expected over the Northern regions with prospects of morning thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of Kaduna, Kebbi, Taraba, Sokoto, Zamfara, Yobe, Jigawa, Kano and Katsina states. Thunderstorms with moderate rains are expected over parts of Borno, Jigawa, Kaduna, Taraba, Adamawa, Bauchi, Yobe, Gombe, Zamfara and Kebbi states in the afternoon/evening hours.

Central Region:

Cloudy skies are anticipated over the region with chances of thunderstorms with rains over parts of Plateau, Niger, the Federal Capital Territory and Nasarawa states during the morning hours. Moderate

rains are expected over parts of the Federal Capital Territory, Plateau, Niger, Benue and Nasarawa states during the afternoon to evening/night periods.

Southern Region:

There are prospects of morning rains over parts of Ebonyi, Akwa Ibom, Rivers and Cross River states, while the remaining parts are expected to be cloudy. Moderate to heavy rains are expected over parts of Ebonyi, Abia, Enugu, Imo, Anambra, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening periods.

Advisory

- i. The states with possibility of Flash Flood should activate emergency response system immediately.
- ii. Driving under heavy rain should be avoided.
- iii. Ensure warm clothing for the vulnerable persons due to low night-time temperatures.
- iv. Strong winds may precede the rains in areas where thunderstorms are likely to occur, public should take adequate precaution.
- v. Ensure that loose objects are fastened to avoid collision.
- vi. Disconnect electrical appliances from electrical sockets.
- vii. Stay away from tall trees to avoid impact from falling branches and broken trees.
- viii. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
