Day 1: Monday 13th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny atmosphere is anticipated over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms over parts of Adamawa and Taraba. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Bauchi, Gombe and Taraba states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours with prospects of isolated thunderstorms over parts of Kogi and Benue states. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Niger, Kwara, Kogi, Benue, Nasarawa, Plateau and the Federal Capital Territory during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is expected over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Imo, Abia, Anambra, Enugu, Ondo, Ogun, Osun, Lagos, Edo, Delta, Cross-River, Akwa-Ibom and Rivers states. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Ogun, Osun, Ekiti, Edo, Imo, Enugu, Anambra, Abia, Ebonyi, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Lagos, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 2: Tuesday 14th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny atmosphere is anticipated over the region with prospects of thunderstorms accompanied by light rains over parts of Taraba and Kebbi states during the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kebbi, Kaduna, Taraba and Adamawa states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region with prospects of light rains over parts of the Federal Capital Territory, Nasarawa, Niger and Benue in the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kwara, Benue, the Federal Capital Territory, Kogi, Nasarawa and Niger states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is anticipated over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by light rains over parts of Cross-River and Akwa-Ibom states. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Ogun, Osun, Ekiti, Edo, Imo, Enugu, Anambra, Abia, Ebonyi, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Lagos, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 3: Wednesday 15th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny skies with patches of clouds are anticipated over the region during the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kaduna, Zamfara, Kebbi, Taraba and Adamawa states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. There are prospects of thunderstorms with moderate rains expected over most parts of the region during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains are expected over parts of Lagos, Cross River, and Akwa Ibom states; while most parts of the region are expected to be mostly cloudy with intervals of sunshine during the morning hours. There are good prospects of widespread thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains expected over most parts of the region during the afternoon/evening hours.

Advisory

- i. Strong winds may precede the rains in areas where thunderstorms are likely to occur, public should take adequate precaution and ensure that loose objects are fastened to avoid collision.
- ii. Driving under heavy rain should be avoided.
- iii. Disconnect electrical appliances from electrical sockets.
- iv. Stay away from tall trees to avoid impact from falling branches and broken trees.
- v. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
- vi. Temperatures are expected to remain high causing thermal discomfort. The public is advised to wear breathable clothing, stay in a well-ventilated environment and stay hydrated.
