Day 1: Tuesday 14th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny atmosphere is anticipated over the region during the morning hours with chances of thunderstorms with rain or without rain over parts of Southern Kebbi and Southern Kaduna states during the afternoon/evening hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Adamawa and Taraba states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. The prospects of thunderstorms with light rain or without rain over parts of Plateau, Niger, Nasarawa and the Federal Capital Territory during the afternoon/evening hours.

There are also prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kwara and Benue states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is expected over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over Cross-River and Akwa-Ibom states. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Ondo, Ogun, Edo, Imo, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Lagos, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 2: Wednesday 15th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny skies are anticipated over the Northern region during the morning hours. There are prospects of thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kaduna, Gombe, Bauchi, Southern Adamawa and Taraba states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region in the morning hours. There are prospects of thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kwara, Benue, the Federal Capital Territory, Kogi, Nasarawa and Niger states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is anticipated over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by light rains over parts of Enugu, Imo, Rivers, Delta, Bayelsa, Cross-River and Akwa-Ibom states. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Oyo, Ogun, Osun, Ekiti, Ondo, Edo, Imo, Enugu, Anambra, Abia, Ebonyi, Delta, Bayelsa, Rivers, Lagos, Cross River and Akwa Ibom states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 3: Thursday 16th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny skies are anticipated over the Northern region during the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Kaduna, Gombe, Bauchi, Taraba and Adamawa states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms with moderate rains expected over some parts of Plateau, Benue and Adamawa during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the region during the morning hours. There are prospects of isolated thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Ogun, Ondo, Imo, Enugu, Anambra, Delta and Bayelsa states during the afternoon/evening hours.

- i. Strong winds may precede the rains in areas where thunderstorms are likely to occur, public should take adequate precaution and ensure that loose objects are fastened to avoid collision.
- ii. Driving under heavy rain should be avoided.
- iii. Disconnect electrical appliances from electrical sockets.
- iv. Stay away from tall trees to avoid impact from falling branches and broken trees.
- v. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
- vi. Temperatures are expected to remain high causing thermal discomfort. The public is advised to wear breathable clothing, stay in a well-ventilated environment and stay hydrated.
