Day 1: Monday 27th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Sunny skies are anticipated over the Northern region with slim prospects of thunderstorms over southern Taraba during the morning hours. There are prospects of thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over parts of Sokoto, Kano, Kebbi, Katsina, Kaduna, Adamawa, Zamfara and Taraba states during the afternoon and evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. There are prospects of thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of Nasarawa, the Federal Capital Territory, Plateau, Benue, Kwara, Niger and Kogi states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is expected over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms with light rains over parts of Akwa Ibom, Rivers, Bayelsa and Cross River states. There are prospects of thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over Ondo, Oyo, Osun, Ogun, Ekiti, Lagos, Imo, Abia, Ebonyi, Anambra, Enugu, Delta, Edo, Cross River, Akwa Ibom, Bayelsa and Rivers states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 2: Tuesday 28th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Moderate dust haze conditions are anticipated over Borno, Yobe, Jigawa and Bauchi states through the forecast period. There are prospects of thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of Adamawa, Taraba, Kebbi, and Kaduna states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. There are prospects of scattered thunderstorms with moderate rains over parts of the Federal Capital Territory, Plateau, Nasarawa, Niger, Benue, Kwara and Kogi states during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is anticipated over the region with slim chances of isolated thunderstorms over parts of Bayelsa and Delta states in the morning hours. There are prospects of widespread thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over the entire southern region during the afternoon/evening hours.

Day 3: Wednesday 29th April, 2026.

Northern Region:

Thick dust haze conditions are anticipated over parts of Borno, Kano, Yobe, Jigawa and Bauchi states through the forecast period. Also, isolated thunderstorms are expected over parts of Taraba state in the morning hours. There are prospects of scattered thunderstorms over parts of Gombe, Bauchi, Adamawa, Taraba, Kaduna and Kebbi states during the afternoon/evening hours.

North Central Region:

Cloudy atmosphere with intervals of sunshine is anticipated over the North central region during the morning hours. There are prospects of scattered thunderstorms with moderate rains across the region during the afternoon/evening hours.

Southern Region:

Cloudy atmosphere is expected over the region during the morning hours with chances of isolated thunderstorms with light rains over parts of Ogun and Lagos states. There are prospects of scattered thunderstorms accompanied by moderate rains over the entire southern region during the afternoon/evening hours.

Advisory

- i. Dust particles are envisaged over the Northern region; the public should take necessary precaution.
- ii. People with Asthmatic health condition and other respiratory issues should be cautious of the expected weather condition.
- iii. Strong winds may precede the rains in areas where thunderstorms are likely to occur, public should take adequate precaution and ensure that loose objects are fastened to avoid collision.
- iv. Driving under heavy rain should be avoided.
- v. Disconnect electrical appliances from electrical sockets.
- vi. Stay away from tall trees to avoid impact from falling branches and broken trees.
- vii. Airline operators are advised to get airport-specific weather reports (flight documentation) from NiMet for effective planning in their operations.
- viii. Temperatures are expected to remain high causing thermal discomfort. The public is advised to wear breathable clothing, stay in a well-ventilated environment and stay hydrated.
