REMARKS

During the week, the Madden-Julian Oscillation (MJO) signal is expected to stay weak over the West African region, however, with good moisture influx, favourable OLR and 200hpa velocity potential anomaly, there are prospects of Heavy rainfall expected over parts of Cross River, Abia, Akwa Ibom and Rivers states. **Moderate to Heavy rainfall is expected** over parts of Taraba, Benue, Cross River, Ebonyi, Enugu, Abia, Imo, Rivers and Bayelsa states while, Low to Moderate rainfall is expected over most parts of the central cities and the southern states. **Low rainfall** is expected over the remaining parts of the country.

Advisory: There are prospects of flash floods on roads, bridges and low-lying areas which can disrupt vehicular traffic. The public is however advised to take necessary safety precautions; do not walk through fast -flowing runoff waters.

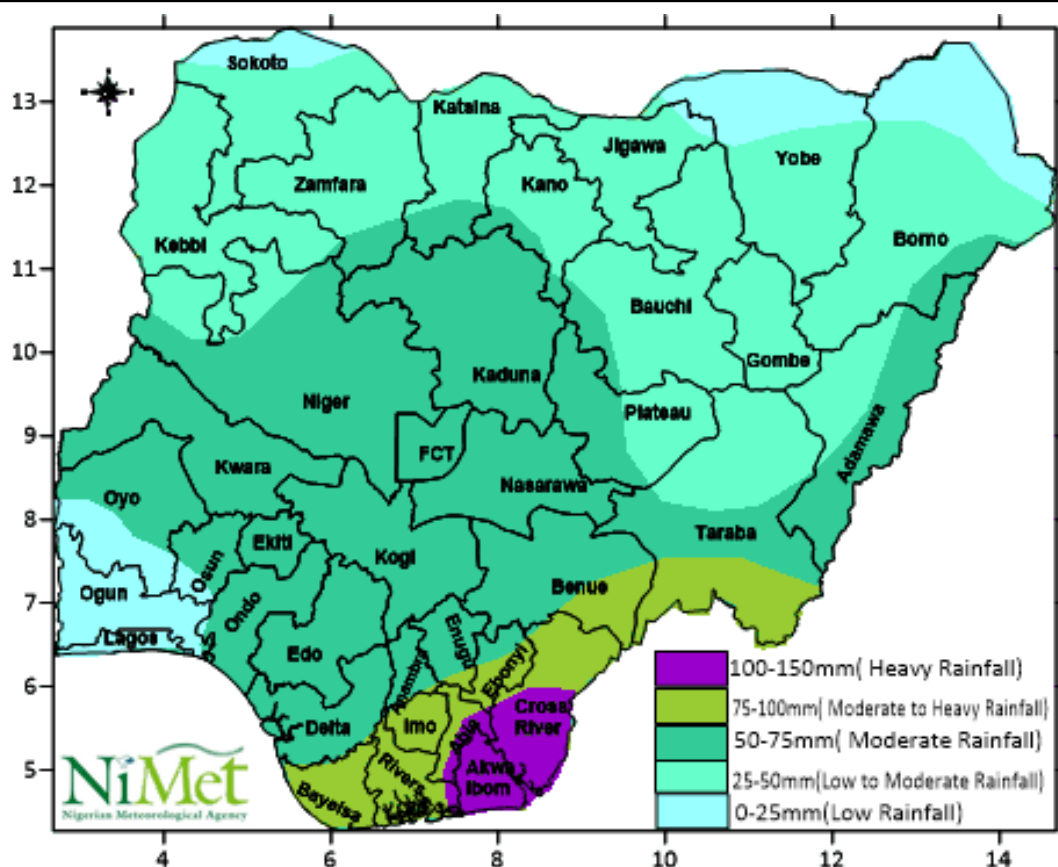


FIGURE 1: SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION OF ANTICIPATED RAINFALL.

2.1 Maximum Temperature

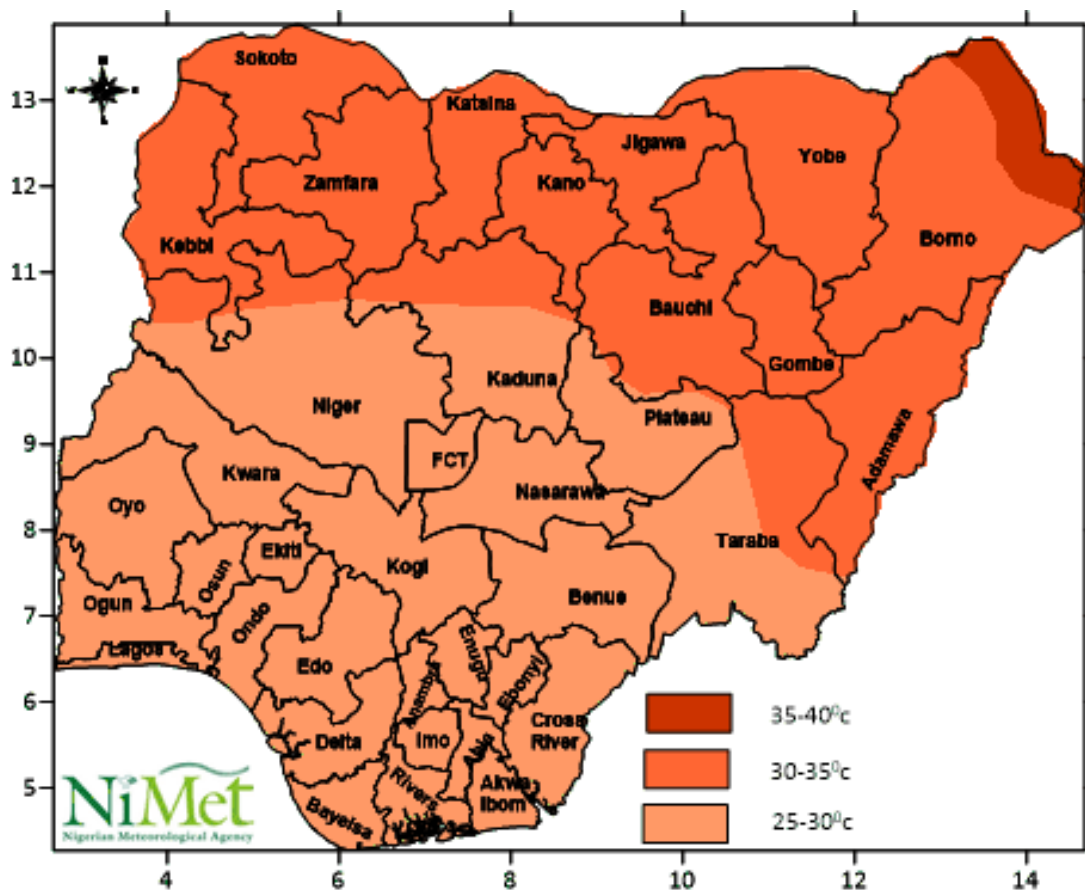


FIGURE 2: SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION OF MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE FORECAST.

Maximum Temperature range of 35°C and above is anticipated over parts of Borno state. Temperature range of 25 –30°C is expected over the north central and southern states. Temperatures range of 30 – 35°C is expected over the remaining parts of the country. See Figure 2.

2.2 Minimum Temperature

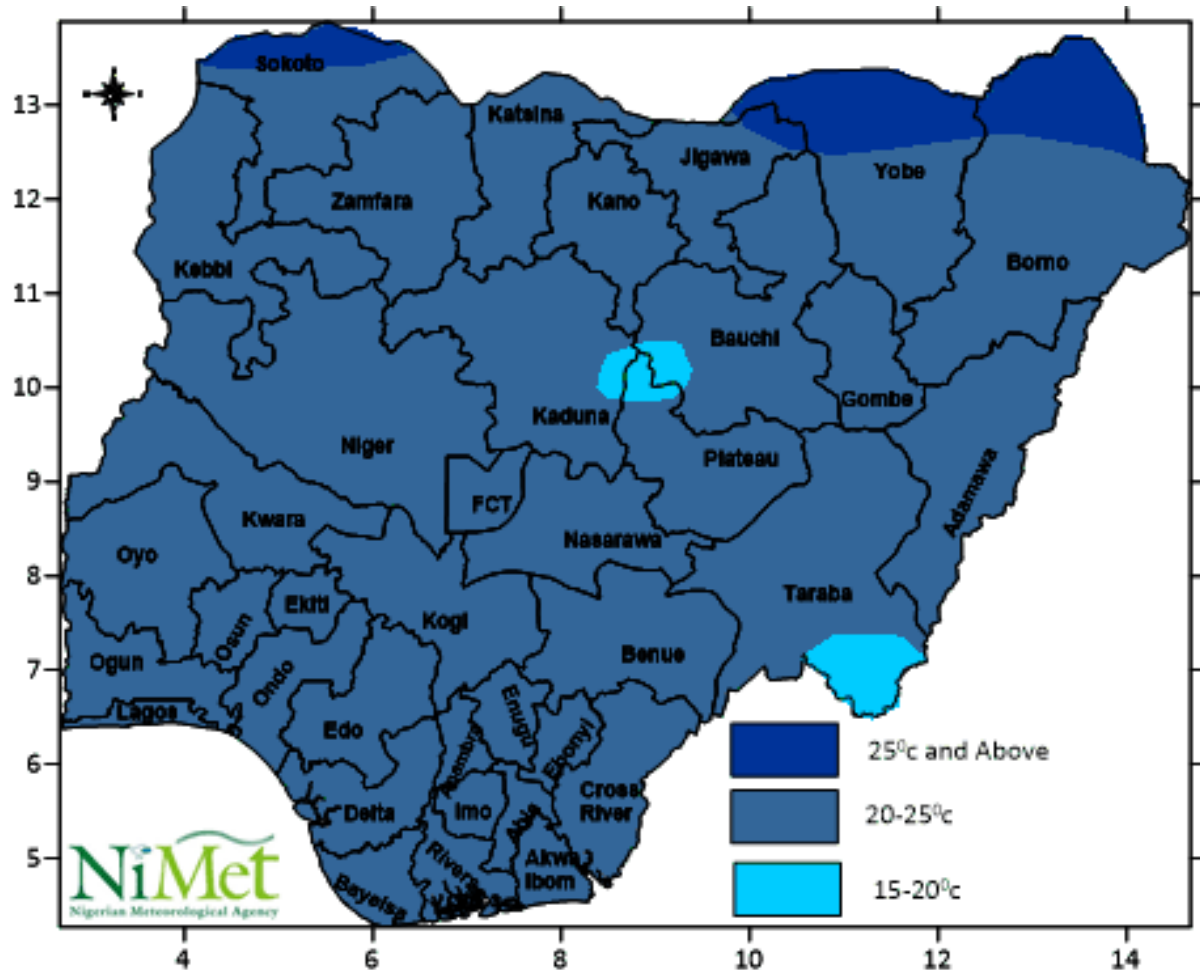


FIGURE 3: SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION OF MINIMUM TEMPERATURE FORECAST.

Minimum temperature range of 25°C and above is expected over parts of Sokoto, Yobe, Borno and Jigawa states. Temperature range of 20 - 25°C is expected over most parts of the country, except for parts of Taraba, Bauchi, Plateau and Kaduna states where temperature ranges between 15- 20°C See Figure 3.
